

# EASY DOES IT!

- 170 cubic-inches of raw power...okay, maybe not, but the 170 Special Six certainly moved this '63 Falcon Deluxe Wagon along 1960s suburbia. With 101 horsepower and an 8.7:1 compression ratio, this little engine provided more than enough power to move the family around town.
- As you would expect, the engine bay on this car is flawless. Correct red paint on the valve cover and air cleaner really set this engine off. Vintage-appearing Autolite batter "topper" is just that; a piece that cleverly disguises a standard-issue modern day battery. Date-coded plug wires are a great added touch.
- Autolite was Ford's engine parts supplier. You could find this name all throughout the engine bay of many Ford products, this 1963 wagon being one of them. Notice the Autolite spark plugs sticker on the air cleaner.
